Identify the error in the following sentence:

Many students that take rigorous English courses in high school spend time analyzing and interpreting prose and poetry by well-respected writers.

- A. that
- B. English
- C. prose
- D. well-respected
- E. No error

Correct Answer: A

Explanation: This sentence refers to English courses taken by high school students. Whenever there is a description of a person or people, the pronoun "who" must be used. Students are not inanimate objects. Therefore, part A should be replaced by "who" in the place of "that." English should always be capitalized because it is a language, "prose" is a form of writing just like poetry and "well-respected" is an adjective that is appropriate to describe writers.

QUESTION 2

Identify the error in the following sentence:

The only person who can make that decision is the president of the United States.

- A. The only person
- B. who can
- C. that decision
- D. the president
- E. No error

Correct Answer: D

Explanation: When referring to a specific individual, this word needs to be capitalized.

QUESTION 3

Identify the error in the following sentence:

Listening to music while working on homework is a dubious habit that many students have and do not want to break.

- A. Listening to music

B. working on

C. dubious

D. break

E. No error

Correct Answer: E

Explanation: This sentence is correct as written.

QUESTION 4

Identify the error in the following sentence:

Him and his sister ran and ran, but they could not seem to get away from the pack of dogs.

A. Him and his sister

B. ran and ran

C. could not seem

D. pack of dogs.

E. No error

Correct Answer: A

Explanation: The correct form would be he and his sister.

QUESTION 5

Identify the error in the following sentence:

The brutally cold days of winter in Minnesota makes Marty consider moving to Florida every year.

A. brutally

B. of winter

C. makes

D. consider moving

E. No error

Correct Answer: C

Explanation: The correct answer is "makes" because the verb "makes" doesn't agree with the plural subject of the sentence, "days." While "Minnesota" is singular and seems to agree with "makes," it is not the subject of the sentence. Remember that the subject and verb of the sentence must agree, even if they are separated by words that make that

agreement sound odd to your ear. If the subject is plural, the verb must agree with a plural noun regardless of the tense of any modifiers between those words. When in doubt, say the subject and verb together without any words in between. In this case, it becomes clear that "days makes" is the problem in this sentence.
